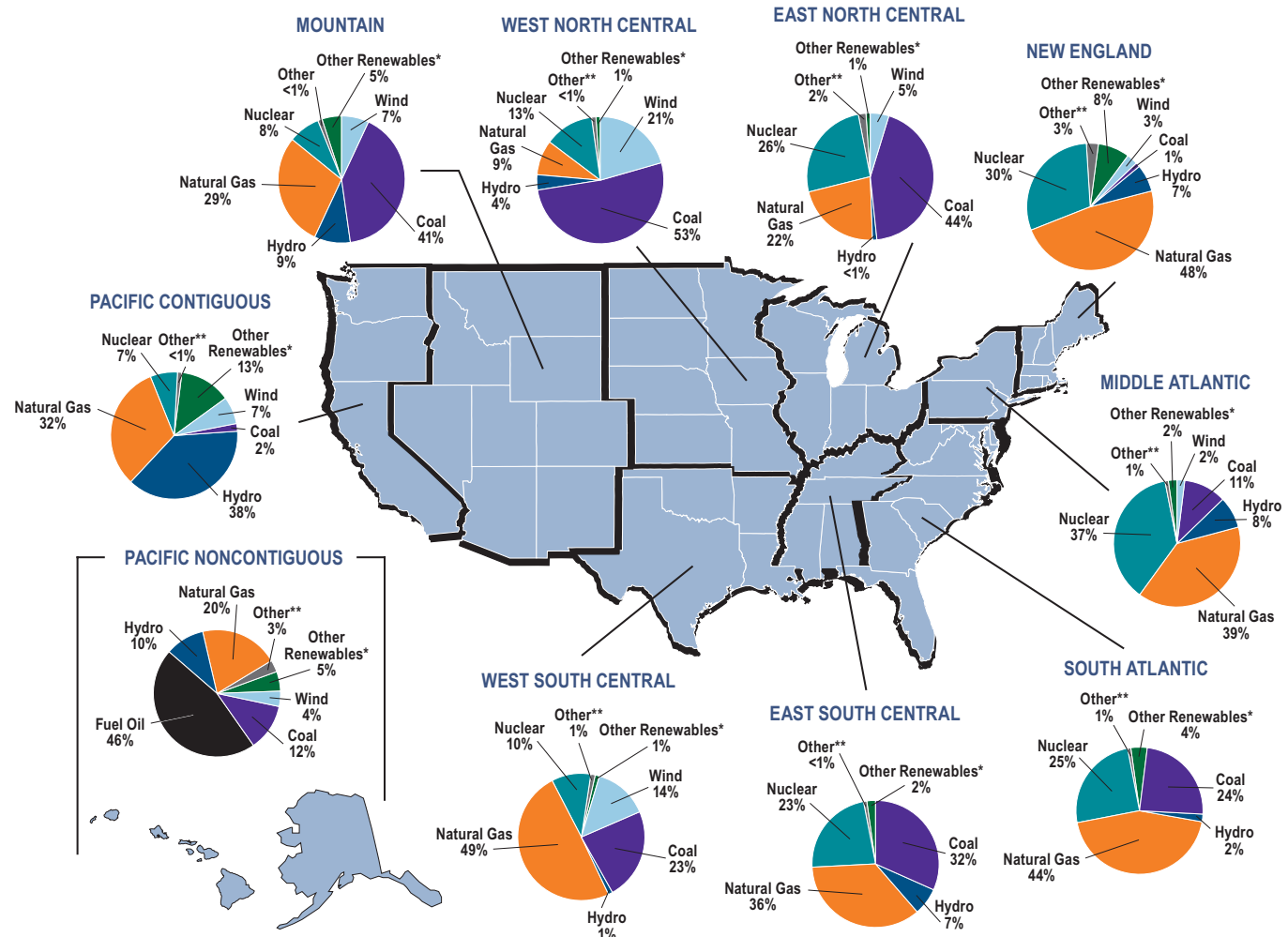


Electric Companies Use a Diverse Mix Of Resources to Generate Electricity



“Non-hydro renewables” includes universal and private generation by biomass (agricultural waste, landfill gas recovery, municipal solid waste, wood, non-wood waste), geothermal, wind, and solar.

“Other” includes generation by tires, batteries, chemicals, hydrogen, pitch, purchased steam, sulfur, and miscellaneous technologies.
